NECA appointed to panel to create pathways for young Australians into jobs

The **National Electrical and Communications Association** (NECA) has been chosen as one of twelve industry groups on the Morrison Government panel to co-design the new \$10 million PaTH Business Placements Partnerships Trial, which will come up with new ways for young people to get into work.

NECA's involvement in the two-year trial will be to provide expertise and knowledge to find new pathways for young people through tailored pre-employment pathways, services and other support. These pathways will be designed to meet the needs of both employers and job seekers.
