



Closure of Market Street and Pitt Street on Monday 26 December 2016

Road closures will be in place in Market Street and Pitt Street on Monday 26 December 2016 for the annual Boxing Day sales.

To ensure the safety of pedestrians and drivers on Boxing Day, roads in the vicinity of Pitt Street mall will begin closing from 1am on 26 December and remain closed until no later than 11pm.

The closure addresses the higher pedestrian demand levels experienced in recent years and will affect Market Street between Elizabeth and York Streets, and Pitt Street between Park and Market streets.

How will it affect me?

Traffic

From 1am on 26 December:

- Market Street will progressively close to general traffic from Elizabeth Street to Pitt Street. Market Street will also be closed between Pitt and York streets from 7am to 11pm.
- Pitt Street will be closed north of the Hilton Hotel driveway. Pitt Street will remain open for driveway access only and changed to two-way operation between Park Street and the Hilton Hotel.
- Local access to George Street between King and Market Streets will be via King Street between 1am and 11pm. Vehicles will not be able to enter this section of George Street via Market Street during this time.

All roads will reopen and return to normal operation by 11pm. Roads may open earlier if pedestrian volumes decrease.

To accommodate traffic flow Elizabeth Street, York Street and Castlereagh Street will remain open to through traffic.

A controlled access point will be in place at the intersection of Pitt Street and Park Street for those who need access to driveways (including Hilton Hotel). The closest drop off point for Market Street hotel guests is on York Street near Market Street.
