EXCELLENCE AWARDS





1. Innovation

A custom designed and produced service, product, tool, system, technology (or similar) that required outstanding problem-solving, innovation and creativity. This innovation may be a physical product, digital platform/system or any other format - but must be directly relatable to the electrical/communications industry, or specifically designed to support an electrical/communications project or business.

2. Work Health & Safety - Excellence in Action

Recognition for companies who have demonstrated an 'above and beyond' commitment to Health and Safety management within their business and/or for major innovative new hazard controls, safety improvements or safety solutions.

3. Women in Energy (Individual)

A recognition award for an individual who is championing change for women in the electrical and communications industry. Their demonstrated actions and efforts have resulted in positive outcomes for women in their business and/or the wider industry community.

4. Leaders in Diversity (Business)

A recognition award for businesses who are industry leaders in diversity and inclusion, with demonstrated actions, policies or strategies that have resulted in positive diversity-related outcomes.

5. Domestic Residence

A single residence project in the domestic sector (as described in AS/NZS 3000, clause 1.4.53) where the contractor has worked with the homeowner to deliver an electrical installation of outstanding quality and use of technology.

6. Lighting Design & Construct

A commercial, industrial, residential, hospitality, retail, entertainment or sports project of any value, where the applicant's influence on lighting resulted in a higher or improved creative and aesthetic design, and/or technical excellence than the original design or concept.

7. Green Energy

A project where the applicant's direct and proactive influence on design, product selection, lighting, processes or technologies resulted in a substantially improved and more sustainable energy efficient installation than the original design or concept.

8. Voice/Data Communications & Audio Visual

An information, voice/data, communications & audio-visual project of any contract value, where the applicant's influence on the project resulted in a higher or improved level of performance and technical excellence than the original design or concept.

8a.Voice/Data Comms & Audio Visual Small Project (available in ACT only)

9. Industrial Small

An industrial project which may also include, but is not limited to, undertakings of a civil, mining, high voltage, manufacturing or process nature; where the applicant's contract value is less than \$1 million.

10. Industrial Large

An industrial project which may include, but is not limited to, undertakings of a civil, mining, high voltage, manufacturing or process nature; where the applicant's contract value is greater than \$1 million.

11. Commercial Small

A commercial project where the applicant's contract value is less than \$2 million, which may include multiple domestic and residential electrical installations (as described in AS/NZS 3000 clauses 1.4.54 and 1.4.55).

12. Commercial Medium

A commercial project where the applicant's contract value is greater than \$2 million and less than \$6 million, which may also include multiple domestic and residential electrical installations (as described in AS/NZS 3000 clauses 1.4.54 and 1.4.55).

13. Commercial Large

A commercial project where the applicant's contract value is greater than \$6 million, which may also include multiple domestic and residential electrical installations (as described in AS/NZS 3000 clauses 1.4.54 and 1.4.55).



SMALL BUSINESS AWARDS

Emerging Small Business

A small business employing less than 10 technical employees, demonstrating a wide range of skills and excellence in electrical installation and/or service.

A Recognition Award for first time entrants during their first five years of business.

Small Contracting Business of the Year

A small business employing less than 10 technical employees, demonstrating a wide range of skills and excellence in electrical installation and/or service.

Small Business Project of the Year

A small business employing less than 10 technical employees. The project may have been commercial, domestic or industrial, which through its delivery has exceeded the expectations of the client and community.



APPRENTICE AWARDS





NECA has a longstanding commitment to education and training. Through its group training companies, it is currently the largest training provider of electrotechnology apprentices in Australia.

ABOUT THE AWARDS

NECA has led the electrotechnology industry's Apprentice Awards for over three decades and continues to work to achieve an ever-increasing level of awareness and respect for electrical and communications apprentices and their employers. NECA recognises the essential role apprentices play in the future of our industry. The Apprentice Awards showcase the outstanding contribution an apprentice can make to the projects they work on and to their employer's business. ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be in their fourth year of training or have recently completed their apprenticeship (within 12 months of completion of apprenticeship). During their apprenticeship, they must be or have been employed by a NECA member or a NECA Group Training apprentice company.

Applicants may only enter one category and must not have been previously nominated in that category.

JUDGING PROCESS

State

Applicants will initially be assessed at a state level, with finalists being invited to an interview with a judging panel. State winners and any placegetters will be invited to receive their award at a state gala awards event. State winners from each category will then be invited to submit a project to be judged for the NECA National Apprentice Awards.

National

Each State winner will be forwarded application details late-September regarding the project they will be required to submit. They will also be interviewed by the national judging panel. Winners for each category will be selected following the interview. Winners and runners up will receive their award at the NECA National Awards on 28 November. in Melbourne.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY (EXCELLENCE AND SMALL BUSINESS AWARDS)

- Entrants must be current NECA contractor members at the time of entry and throughout the award process.
- At the time of submission, the project needs to be beyond practical completion stage.
- All entries must be completed online via the Awards portal.
- All required questions must be completed for an entry to be valid.
- Entrants must adhere to the criteria of the Awards Category being entered.
- Projects may be entered into a maximum of two categories. Each entry must reflect the specific criteria of the category, supported by visual evidence specific to that category (with the exception of the Innovation Award category).
- A project may not be entered into the awards over consecutive years.
- Entrants must obtain client permission to submit a project. This includes obtaining written permission from the client to use photographs in the entry and gain site access for the purposes of judging where required.
- By entering a project, you give NECA permission to use project details and photographs on the NECA website, magazine, promotional material, social media and media.

 Entrants must clearly identify in their submission, any connection either the project or the entrant (or its Company) has with any NECA board representative.
